ALISON KELLY  
was born in London in 1959 and began playing the violin at the age of 11. She entered the Royal Academy of Music in 1975 and studied with Ralph Holmes and Emanuel Hurwitz. She won many prizes, including the highest award for violin playing, the Marjorie Hayward prize, and gained her violin diploma. After leaving the academy, she won a Countess of Munster award and an Ian Fleming award, and in 1983 received a Milibem Fellowship from the Royal Academy of Music.

She has performed concertos at St John's, Smith Square, and on the South Bank. In the 1983 Greenwich Festival she have her first performance as director/soloist of the Britannia Chamber players. In June 1984 she gave a recital in the Purcell Room as part of the Westmoreland concerts, sponsored by the Royal Academy of Music.
