Review of our last Concert

As I was not familiar with the three pieces on the program, I came to the concert by the DSO with a real sense of anticipation. I was not disappointed.

I always find Julian's notes useful, but as I listened to the "feast" presented to us my mind took off on its own flight of fancy. The Dvorak variations had all the ingredients of a colourful buffet – so many different tastes and sensations, sweet and delicate, mellow and sharp, with a hint of dry white wine. There was also sparkling conversation and laughter between the various sections of the orchestra.

The Rodrigo guitar concerto was a delight and I was left wanting more. I was surprised at how well the combination of the orchestra, with the solo guitar, managed to convey that special atmosphere of a warm Spanish evening at fiesta time.

I have become increasingly impressed by the standards reached by the DSO. I am not a musician, so I can only sit back and enjoy, and again I was not disappointed.

If the whole concert was a feast, then the Sibelius symphony was the meaty main course. All the grandeur of his homeland is conveyed in his music. The concert was over too soon, but I am always glad to be left wanting more. Thanks once again for a delightful evening to all the members of the orchestra.
